

2015 Federal Election – Have Your Say

The Schizophrenia Society of Canada, as part of our work through the Canadian Alliance on Mental Illness and Mental Health, is calling on all of the major political parties in this current election to support a five-year \$50 million **Mental Health Innovation Fund**. While the current government chose not to invest in this important initiative, we are confident that the next government in Ottawa will do so, with your help.

What Are We Asking You To Do?

1. Familiarize yourself with the initiative

The **Mental Health Innovation Fund** would support the identification of and spread of evidence-based mental health programs, resources and services that we know are effective at the community level. An example would be the First Episode Clinics of varying sizes that exist in select centres throughout Canada. The Fund would also have a clear mandate to encourage the dissemination and implementation of best and promising practices of services, supports and resources to improve health outcomes, and establish and report on performance indicators.
